Gudbrandsdalsleden, which means the path of Gudbrandsdalen, stretches from Oslo to Trondheim, a 643 km well-marked pilgrim path with beautiful and varied landscape. Along the path you can experience soothing agricultural landscapes, you can spend the night on historic farms in Gudbrandsdalen, wander across the mighty Dovrefjell plateau and enjoy the tranquility of the lush Trøndelag nature.

East or west?

Gudbrandsdalsleden starts in Oslo, at the ruins of the St. Hallvard Cathedral. Shortly after the starting point, the trail splits into a western and an eastern route, each following one side of Lake Mjøsa, before they converge again in Lillehammer.

Tunsbergleden

Larvik – Tønsberg – Oslo

West of the Oslo fjord you will find Tunsbergleden with a variety of cultural experiences in lush countryside and easily accessible terrain. Here, the pilgrim season is long, and you can enjoy the softwood forests, light green in the spring and red in the fall. The trail passes through residential areas with everyday life and historic city centers and streets.

Borgleden

Halden – Sarpsborg – Ås – Oslo

Through a varied and lush landscape you can experience the Borgleden from the Swedish border in Halden, through the south eastern part of Norway all the way to Oslo. Have a look at the recommended pilgrimage which is suitable for day trips, short walks or as part of a long walk.
